

LEAD WILDLIFE TECHNICIAN

BACKGROUND:

The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is starting a project to better understand and manage Tribal natural resources. Lead Technician will apply wildlife management principles and techniques within the context of the Kaibab Paiute Reservation and scope of work in the grant requirements.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

Define mule deer, big horn sheep, and wildlife management objectives within the scope of the grant. Improve capabilities within the Wildlife Department to assess and manage Reservation wildlife resources. Conduct research relevant to tribal interests and put together rain water troughs. Estimate size and sex of a portion of the Zion mule deer herd and big horn sheep. Document and preserve Kaibab Paiute traditional ecological knowledge of wildlife resources. Insure quarterly and final reports are written, record all equipment purchases, and supervise a part-time Wildlife Technician. All other duties as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be able to use a computer and write monthly, quarterly, and annual reports
- Have basic outdoor skills, ability to hike over rough terrain for long distances and in adverse weather conditions
- Lift up to 45 lbs and carry equipment
- Must have excellent communication skills and be able to work with people of all ages
- Must be able to work independently with limited or no direct supervision
- Must have a high school diploma or GED
- Have a valid driver's license, good driving record and be insurable
