





- 6020 CHARIPERSON'S SALARY
50% of the Chariperson's salary is paid from the Tribal Budget.
- 6110 FRINGE BENEFITS
50% of Social Security, State Unemployment & Workers' Compensation on Chairperson's Salary.
- 6120 HEALTH INSURANCE
50% of Health & Dental Insurance expense for Chairperson.
- 6210 TRAVEL/TRAINING/AUTO MAINTENANCE
\$17,000.00 travel/training expense for administrative staff, \$5,000.00 for administrative vehicle maintenance.
- 7010 INSURANCE
Covers \$34,000.00 towards Property & General Liability and \$6,000.00 for Admin vehicle insurance.
- 7060 OFFICE/COMPUTER SUPPLIES
Covers computers and software upgrades, office supplies such as pens, pencils, postage, calculators, copy machine service agreement & paper and other misc. items for administration.
- 7062 JANITORIAL SUPPLIES
Supplies necessary to clean tribally owned buildings (Administration building, Tribal Court/BIA offices, NPS, Joint Museum/Visitor Center).
- 7065 COUNCIL TRAVEL EXPENSES
Covers \$200.00 per day for council travel to meetings & trainings.
- 7066 GENERAL MEETING ACTIVITIES
Covers printing costs & food expense.
- 7067 COUNCIL EXPENSES
Covers expenses incurred by council for meetings, cell phones, travel, lunches & special occasions.
- 7069 COUNCIL COMPENSATION
\$200.00 per meeting per council member for twelve monthly meetings.
- 7110 PROFESSIONAL FEES
\$15,000.00 toward annual audit & \$5,000.00 for accounting software tech support.
- 7120 ATTORNEY FEES
Legal fees for conducting tribal business.
- 7210 UTILITIES
Covers services provided by Garkane Electric & Gas, Dept. of Public Works for tribally owned buildings.
- 7220 TELEPHONE & INTERNET SERVICE
Covers monthly phone & internet expenses for the administration offices to conduct tribal business.
- 7240 STORE MAINTENANCE
Covers repairs & maintenance of the Chevron store.
- 7330 ELECTIONS
Funds to conduct tribal elections, includes postage, wages & misc.
- 7340 EMPLOYEE APPRECIATION
Funds service awards & end of year employee party given by the Tribal Council.
- 7343 SEASONAL EVENTS
Covers expenses for 3 seasonal events for the community, Easter, Halloween & Christmas.
- 7344 YOUTH ACTIVITIES
Funds for Youth Activities.
- SOUNDS OF THUNDER MOUNTAIN
Covers expenses that are over and above the Gaming budget.
- 7920 CONTINGENCY
Covers expenses that are over and above the budgeted line item.



Wildlife, Fisheries & Parks Department

Tribal Hunters – Remember to turn in your White tag to the Wildlife Department filled out. If you don't you can't get another permit and to those that haven't looked at your permit the first hunt is over it ended on November 11, 2018.

Second Tribal Hunt – December 06-31, 2018 which is a Management Hunt for Moccasin Mountain from the Horn Gate to the Tower.

Minors Hunters Safety Card – Go to hunter-ed.com - Everyone below the age of 18 needs to attend a hunter's safety course or they need to attend one of the ones we do every October during the Youth Hunt, the child will need one to get a hunting permit. This is not something new it has been in the Ordinance since the beginning.

Fish pond - We will try to get another delivery of fish soon.

Coyote - Are being seen in Village areas, Remember to not keep food out for your pets, coyotes will eat it, when you let your pet outside keep an eye on it, coyotes have taken pets down near the homes. Because of the concern of Coyotes coming into the Villages we have asked the trapper to come back out and trap them, The Trapper has been out so keep you pets inside or watch them closely. If you encounter or see a coyote in your village call Wildlife as soon as you can.

Big Game Hunts – 1. Hunt is November 17-21, 2018, and the luncheon will be at the Pavilion at noon. 2. Hunt is November 24- 28, 2018 and the luncheon will be on the 26, at the pavilion. 3. Hunt is December 1 – 5, 2018 the luncheon will be at noon, at the Community Center.

Moccasin Mountain – In the past we have asked Tribal Members to stay off Moccasin Mountain while the Big Game hunting is going on, this is so the paying hunter can take a Mule Deer, so if Tribal Member would stay off the mountain that would be good, Thank You...


WATCHOUT FOR DEER - on County Road 240 Slow down when you see them, as they jump out without warning..

Off Highway Vehicles (OHV) - stay on the dirt roads, this also means stay out of the washes and watch out for Cattle. KEEP MAIN GATES CLOSED!!!

Back Dirt Roads – If for some reason you take the back roads, beware of the sandy and mud, remember to tell someone where you are going and about when you will return, take a lot of water and some snacks, and bring a shovel, tow chain, and a jack, and pickup all litter, KEEP MAIN GATES CLOSED!!!, if the road gets sandy or muddy turn back you don't want to get stuck. If you know of someone that has gone out and not returned call this Department at any time, contact any Wildlife Committee member, or BIA-Police.

Litter and Empty bullet casings – we are starting to see trash along the back roads (i.e. pop cans, and wrappers) and empty bullet shell casings, SO PLEASE PICKUP YOUR TRASH!!!

❖ 20 minutes per day.	❖ 5 minutes per day.	❖ 1 minute per day
❖ 3,600 minutes per school year.	❖ 900 minutes per school year.	❖ 180 minutes per school year.
❖ 1,800,000 words per year.	❖ 282,000 words per year.	❖ 8,000 words per year.
❖ Scores in the 90 th percentile on standardized tests.	❖ Scores in the 50 th percentile on standardized tests.	❖ Scores in the 10 th percentile on standardized tests.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.


Looking for Election Committee Members!!
