## Traveling Vietnam War Memorial Wall


The Veteran War Memorial Wall was in Hurricane, UT for one week. Many Southern Paiute people attended the event. It was a very heartening experience and one to never forget.







# SCRAPBOOKING NIGHT





## **Kaibab National Forest Seeks Public Input on Project Proposal**

**Fredonia, Ariz., Mar. 11, 2015 — For Immediate Release.** The Kaibab National Forest is seeking comments from the public on its proposal to implement vegetation management treatments in the Burnt Corral Vegetation Management Project area within 28,060 acres of the North Kaibab Ranger District.

The proposed Burnt Corral project, which lies within the southwest portion of the Kaibab Plateau, will improve forest health and vigor while enhancing habitat conditions by making them more resilient to change in the event of wildfire or other climatic condition changes such as drought. The proposed project calls for mechanical thinning as well as the use of prescribed fire.

The public scoping letter and packet, which contains detailed information about the proposed project activities, was mailed out to the public and stakeholders yesterday. The scoping packet may be obtained electronically from the Kaibab National Forest website at:

Participation of interested persons, state and local governments, and Native American tribes in the development of the Burnt Corral project is encouraged now and throughout the National Environmental Policy Act process. Public scoping and gathering public comments on the project's Proposed Action is just the first step under the NEPA process.

Specific comments on this project will be accepted during the 30-day public review and comment period. Comments can be submitted electronically via fax or e-mail, or can be mailed or hand-delivered to the district office at 430 South Main Street in Fredonia on weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.



On March 13, the youth placed cups in the fence at the community building with a statement to "Butt Out" to raise the awareness of tobacco use.

## Tribal Motor Vehicle Crash Injury Prevention Program

March 2015



### **April is Distracted Driving Month-**

Each day in the United States, more than 9 people are killed and more than 1,153 people are injured in crashes that are reported to involve a distracted driver.<sup>1</sup> Distracted driving is driving while doing another activity that takes your attention away from driving. Distracted driving can increase the chance of a motor vehicle crash.

There are three main types of distraction:

- Visual: taking your eyes off the road;
- Manual: taking your hands off the wheel; and
- Cognitive: taking your mind off of driving.<sup>1</sup>

Distracted driving activities include things like using a cell phone, texting, and eating. Using in-vehicle technologies (such as navigation systems) can also be sources of distraction. While any of these distractions can endanger the driver and others, texting while driving is especially dangerous because it combines all three types of distraction.<sup>1</sup>

### ***Talking on a cell phone while driving***

- 69% of drivers in the United States ages 18-64 reported that they had talked on their cell phone while driving within the 30 days before they were surveyed.
- In 2012, 3,328 people were killed in crashes involving a distracted driver, compared to 3,360 in 2011. An additional, 421,000 people were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving a distracted driver in 2012, a 9% increase from the 387,000 people injured in 2011.<sup>1</sup>
- In 2011, nearly one in five crashes (17%) in which someone was injured involved distracted driving.<sup>2</sup>
- In December 2012, more than 171 billion text messages were sent or received in the US.<sup>1</sup>

### ***Texting or emailing while driving***

- 31% of U.S. drivers ages 18-64 reported that they had read or sent text messages or email messages while driving at least once within the 30 days before they were surveyed.
- In Europe, this percentage ranged from 15% in Spain to 31% in Portugal.<sup>3</sup>

## What are the risk factors?

- Some activities—such as texting—take the driver's attention away from driving more frequently and for longer periods than other distractions.
- Younger, inexperienced drivers under the age of 20 may be at increased risk; they have the highest proportion of distraction-related fatal crashes.
- Texting while driving is linked with drinking and driving or riding with someone who has been drinking among high school students in the United States, according to a CDC study that analyzed self-report data from the 2011 national Youth Risk Behavior Survey. Students who reported engaging in risky driving behaviors said that they did so at least once in the 30 days prior to the survey. Key findings from the study revealed that:
  - Nearly half of all U.S. high school students aged 16 years or older text or email while driving.
  - Students who text while driving are nearly twice as likely to ride with a driver who has been drinking and five times as likely to drink and drive than students who don't text while driving.
  - Students who frequently text while driving are more likely to ride with a drinking driver or drink and drive than students who text while driving less frequently.

## Cell phones and texting

### March 2015

Talking on a hand-held cell phone while driving is banned in 14 states and the District of Columbia.

The use of all cell phones by novice drivers is restricted in 37 states and the District of Columbia.

Text messaging is banned for all drivers in 45 states and the District of Columbia. In addition, novice drivers are banned from texting in three states (Missouri, Oklahoma and Texas).

Many localities have enacted their own bans on cell phones or text messaging. In some but not all states, local jurisdictions need specific statutory authority to do so. In addition, most school bus drivers are banned from texting and using hand-held cell phones by state code, regulation or school district policy.

The table and maps below show the states that have cell phone laws, whether they specifically ban text messaging, and whether they are enforced as primary or secondary laws. Under secondary laws, an officer must have some other reason to stop a vehicle before citing a driver for using a cell phone. Laws without this restriction are called primary.<sup>6</sup>


